

## Qualification List for Subject Exemptions from Intermediate in Applied Banking & Finance (IABF) Examination

Selected subject exemptions from IABF level will be considered only for the major subject of degrees offered by the state universities approved by the University Grants Commission (UGC) and other foreign universities accepted and approved by the UGC or other professional qualifications recognized by the IBSL if that subject/s is / are offered in IABF.

Subject exemptions for more than one subject may be considered for those who hold more than one academic / full professional qualification, if major subjects in those qualifications are recognized by IBSL and are offered in IABF.

The following short listed qualifications may be considered for subject exemptions subject to case by case basis evaluation by IBSL on exemption requests.
